## **Official Village Notification System**

Terrace Park uses an all-call system called CodeRED for emergency notifications. In addition we send texts and emails for general announcements, like solicitors approved or road closures, through the CodeRED system. Please go to the Terrace Park web site and click on the CodeRED icon to register you and your family. In addition, we post all notices on our website and Facebook page.

## Village Website <u>www.terracepark.org</u>

The Terrace Park Village Website is a valuable source of information. It is regularly updated with meeting dates, council minutes, and other timely information. You can find contacts for Village Council and Clubs. You can find all ordinances as well as any form you might need to fill out.

# **Resident Key Box**

You may provide TPPD with a key to your home. In the event of an emergency or a family member is locked out, a key can be retrieved from TPPD's secure key box. Just drop by the Village office to complete the Key Log Form (also available online) and submit with a key. On the form, a resident may indicate who is able to receive the key from TPPD. Identification will be checked before any keys are released to those listed on the form.

### **Vacation Checks**

TPPD provides "Vacation Checks" of your property while you are out of town. While on your trip, an officer will check your property and doors to insure that all are secure. If anything suspicious is noted, the officer will contact you and the situation can be addressed. To receive a Vacation Check, fill out the Confidential Vacation Report available on the website and in the Village Office. Drop off the completed form prior to your trip.

# **Community Building and Village Green Rental**

Terrace Park residents may reserve the Community Building, Village Green or Log Cabin for parties, meetings, and other events.

To reserve the Community Building or Log Cabin, check the community calendar (on our website) and then call the office to reserve your date. Once a date has been determined, fill out a rental agreement and bring that along with the fee of \$100.00. Groups who are exempt from the rental fee include any "religious, educational or charitable organization which has their headquarters in Terrace Park or any group approved exempt by Council." The Village Green is free of charge; however, if more than 25 people will attend or the event will be more than 2 hours, you must rent a porta potty (Rumpke is easiest 851-0122). All trash must be removed from the Green when the event is over. You can take it home or you can put it in the bins behind the Village Office.

### **Solicitors**

The Village regulates solicitors and peddlers in the park. As stated in Terrace Park's Code of Ordinances, any solicitor who is actively selling or promoting a business must obtain a license at the Village office. TPPD has a required form that must be submitted by the solicitor and then background checks are completed. In addition, this 30 day license costs \$25.00. Once approved, Chief Hayhow will present the solicitor with a badge that must be visible at all times while in Terrace Park and we will send a text/email through CodeRED. If someone approaches your residence to sell or promote anything, make sure they are wearing this badge. If this person does not have an approved badge from TPPD, call the Village office immediately.

This application process does not apply to anyone representing a religious or charitable non-for-profit organization, including political candidates. A license is not required for these individuals.

If you prefer to not be approached by any type of solicitor, the Village office has laminated signs for your front door stating "No canvassers, peddlers, solicitors". To receive one of these signs, stop by TPVO.

### **Environmental Services**

Environmental Services is located across from the Village Green. Acceptable materials must be sorted to conform to the categories described below and deposited in the proper areas for contractor disposal. All yard waste must be from Terrace Park. The following items may be disposed of:

Grass, leaves, small weeds, flowers- to be mixed for composting

Woody Materials-less than 3"diameter-Large Weeds

Logs and Large Brush over 3" diameter, sawed to firewood length and left with the firewood.

Dirt, rocks, and some concrete.

## **Recreational Vehicle Parking**

Vehicle storage is available at the Environmental Storage Area (ESA). In addition to yard waste disposal, this area is used for storage of motorized vehicles, boats on trailers, and RVs. Small boats that can be carried by a single person may also be stored in this area. Terrace Park residents may use this area free of charge; however, residents must apply for vehicle storage approval at the Village Office (application available online). While the storage area is monitored by TPPD on a regular basis, the Village of Terrace Park is not responsible for the vehicle or its contents while parked at the ESA. # **Notary Service**

Documents may be notarized at the Village office. Officer Tim Chin, and Clerk of Courts, Bob Barket, are both Notaries and offer their services free of charge. When a notary signature is needed, please call TPVO at 831-2137 to make sure one of these notaries is available.

# **Brush and Leaf Pick up**

The Village of Terrace Park Maintenance Department picks up brush every Monday and Tuesday. Please put your brush out early as they make one pass every week. Items too small to be picked up with a pitchfork should be placed in paper lawn waste bags for pick up. The maintenance department follows a specific route through the village with the goal of reaching each street at least once per week. Items too large will be picked up by the backhoe after the regular route is finished.

Leaves are picked up in the fall. Our office notifies Village residents through CodeRED, the Village Website and our Facebook page when leave pick up begins and ends. During leaf pick up brush is not picked up. Please do not mix leaves with brush. Leaf piles must be free of rocks, bricks, and foreign material as these items can lead to costly equipment repairs and long delays in leaf removal for the Village. Also, please do not leave piles of leaves in the street.

## **Recycling and Trash Pickup**

As a village service, all residences receive either a large green wheeler or smaller red bin for RECYCLING. A homeowner must then leave the recycling container when moving from the residence. If you are a new resident and your purchased home did not come with a RECYCLING container, please contact the previous owner and try to retrieve the container. If you are unable to reach the previous owner, please contact the village office at 831-2138 for a replacement.

Homeowners provide their own TRASH containers which can be rented from Rumpke or purchased at a hardware store. Rumpke trash collection is paid for by the village and collected every Tuesday. Place cans or bags out by 6 a.m. Tuesday, but not before 4 p.m. on Monday. Yard waste will not be collected by Rumpke.

## **Village Trees**

A computerized tree inventory is maintained by the Village of Terrace Park. Information contained in the database includes location, species, size, and condition of over 2500 street trees. The program allows for the tracking of work requests through completion, providing a complete work history of individual trees. All of these trees are located in the Village right-of-way and are part of a comprehensive forestry management plan. Both public and private trees are valuable resources and contribute significantly to the quality of life in Terrace Park.

The map on file in the Village Office may help in determining if a tree is part of the urban forestry plan or is privately owned. The right-of-ways in Terrace Park vary from 20-60 feet. By using an imaginary line in the center of the street and measuring half the distance of the indicated right-of-way to the abutting property, you may be able to determine responsibility for a particular specimen.

## **Special Information Regarding the Siren**

In Terrace Park, the outdoor warning siren signals are tested at noon the first Wednesday of each month. **Steady Tone:** A **Tornado Warning** or a **Severe Thunderstorm Warning** during a Tornado Watch In Hamilton County, the outdoor warning sirens will sound a steady tone for five (5) minutes. Seek safe shelter when severe weather threatens.

**Wavering Tone:** Enemy Nuclear Attack Warning The outdoor warning sirens will sound a wavering tone for five (5) minutes.

#### In case of warning sound:

- Turn on TV and radio for emergency information.
- Seek immediate protection from radioactive fallout in the best available shelter, preferably a basement location.
- Have available a battery operated radio and a tone alerting weather radio

Acceptable unsolicited offers and endorsements include yard sales; items for sale including household items, tickets, cars, homes (owned by person posting and not as a commercial venture); babysitting; domestic construction and repair services; students offering part-time or summer work; and fundraisers and events for non-profit organizations in Terrace Park and surrounding neighborhoods. Requesting recommendations and giving endorsements when they've been requested is fine. TP Listserv is not monitored by the Village Office or TPPD on a regular basis and should not be considered a way to notify the office of an incident or issue. Please call 513-831-2137 to make reports or requests. While the office often conveys information on the TPList, important and official notices are sent through CodeRED, the Village Facebook Page and the Village Website.

# **Grand Valley**

Terrace Park residents have access to the beautiful lake and walking trails at Grand Valley nature preserve. Located in Camp Dennison, just a few short minutes from Terrace Park, Grand Valley was acquired by the Village of Indian Hill in 2002. A former excavation site, the preserve was designed to restore wildlife and provide opportunities for walking, canoeing and fishing. This preserve is strictly limited to Indian Hill residents and Indian Hill Water residential customers, which includes Terrace Park residents. An access key is required and can be obtained at the Indian Hill Administration building 8:00-5:00 Monday-Friday with proof of residency.
