## MINUTES OF MEETING January 14,2024

# VILLAGE OF TERRACE PARK COUNCIL HAMILTON COUNTY, OHIO

Council met on Tuesday January 14,2025 at 6:00 p.m. in the Terrace Park Community Building. Mayor Tepe led Council in the Pledge of Allegiance. Members of Council present were Mr. Jeff LeMay, Ms. Lauren Ingebritson, Mr. Pax Lindell, Mr. John Gaskey, Ms. Judith Lehman and Ms. Regina Sharp. In addition, Mayor Tom Tepe, Village Administrator and Police Chief Gerald Hayhow, Chief Fiscal Officer and Clerk of Council, Katie Lyons, Solicitor Jeff Forbes, and EMS Chief John Maggard.

The Mayor asked if anyone had any corrections, additions or deletions to the December 11,2024 Minutes. Council Member John Gaskey motioned to approve the Council Minutes from the December 11, 2024 Council Meeting. Voice vote, all voted, aye. Minutes approved.

**RESIDENTS TO ADDRESS COUNCIL** The Mayor asked if there were any residents to address council, to please approach the podium, state their name and their address. Seeing none, he moved on.

## **MAYOR'S REPORT:**

Mayor Tepe thanked John Maggard for his willingness to step in to be the Fire Chief during this transitional period. Tonight, we are appointing a new Fire Chief, George Heffner, who stood out amongst his peers. Following that, are the appointments of the Fire Department Staff to new roles. Prior to that we are amending our Ordinance to make room for the positions proposed.

Mayor Tepe asked Ms. Lehman to move up in the agenda the Ordinance regarding the composition of the Fire Department. Gaskey, Lehman, LeMay, Ingebritson, Lindell and Sharp voted aye. Lehman then moved to adopt the ordinance as an emergency. Ingebritson seconded. Gaskey, Lehman, Ingebritson, Lindell, LeMay, and Sharp voted aye. Resolution passed as an emergency.

Each Member was sworn in by Mayor Tepe.

The Mayor resumed with his report thanking the Maintenance Department for their hard work, especially with the back to back snow storms.

Chief Fiscal Officer: Katie Lyons- no report.

**Solicitor:** Jeff Forbes- the Governor signed House Bill 315, which had buried in there specific to Police Departments. In the past, videos requested for public records had to be released. This Bill allows to charge for the personal time to be charged to the requestor.

Clerk of Council: Katie Lyons- no report.

EMS CHIEF: Chief Maggard submitted an annual report, which he hasn't done in years. (see attached)

EMS class begins Tuesday January 21, 2025, with 8 students.

FIRE CHIEF: Chief Heffner -no report.

POLICE CHIEF/VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR:

- Maintenance guys each had 46 hours of Overtime during the last 2 storms, putting down 72 tons
  of salt.
- Duke has delayed the start of the project due to the weather.

- Ending fund balance(cash on hand) increased \$122,000 vs. previous year
- Revenue \$24,000 higher than last year
- Expenses \$160,000 lower than last year.
- We underspent by \$170,000, received more money in property taxes
  - This would be attributable to the recent home sales.

Fiscal 2025 Goals:

- Maintain fiscally responsible spending and conservative revenue outlook.
  - o Develop a 10 year budget forecast.
  - o Develop a financing plan for Elm Street waterline. \$440,000.

Mr. LeMay reminded council and the residents that it has been 11 years since a new levy has been added to the ballot.


nding Fund Balance (cash on hand) increased \$122K vs. previous year.
