# MINUTES OF MEETING February 11,2025

# VILLAGE OF TERRACE PARK COUNCIL HAMILTON COUNTY, OHIO

Council met on Tuesday February 11,2025 at 6:00 p.m. in the Terrace Park Community Building. Mayor Tepe led Council in the Pledge of Allegiance. Members of Council present were Mr. Jeff LeMay, Ms. Lauren Ingebritson, Mr. Pax Lindell, Mr. John Gaskey, and Ms. Regina Sharp. In addition, Mayor Tom Tepe, Village Administrator and Police Chief Gerald Hayhow, Chief Fiscal Officer and Clerk of Council, Katie Lyons, Solicitor Jeff Forbes, Fire Chief George Heffner, and EMS Chief John Maggard. Ms. Judith Lehman was absent.

The Mayor asked if anyone had any corrections, additions or deletions to the January 14,2025 Minutes. Council Member Regina Sharp motioned to approve the Council Minutes from the January 14,2025 Council Meeting. Voice vote, all voted, aye. Minutes approved.

FIRE CHIEF: Chief Heffner reported the following: (see attached handout for details)

- Dept. training to date included, SCBA Training, Engineer Training, Truck Training, live Fire
  exercises and Radio Training Drills. Training attendance has significantly increased.
- Assistant Chief Ty Zimmerman has planned the training for the entire year.
- Chief Heffner is now requiring each firefighter to attend 1 live fire training annually. The fire
  department will be upgrading their training standards to become Level 1 firefighters. Chief
  Heffner is currently updating the standard operating procedures to ensure safety, compliance
  and efficiency with the best practices. Working to equip engine 94 as a basic response vehicle at
  minimal cost.

Mr. LeMay introduced and advanced to the third reading RESOLUTION NO. 2-1, 2025 RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE COUNTY AUDITOR TO MAKE TAX ADVANCES DURING THE YEAR 2025 PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED CODE, SECTION 321.34 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY Lindell seconded. Gaskey, LeMay, Ingebritson, Lindell and Sharp voted aye. LeMay then moved to adopt the resolution as an emergency. Ingebritson seconded. Gaskey, Ingebritson, Lindell, LeMay, and Sharp voted aye. Resolution passed as an emergency.

Mr. LeMay introduced and advanced to the third reading RESOLUTION 2-2, 2025 AUTHORIZING CONTINUING INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR THE VILLAGE OF TERRACE PARK UNDER THE OHIO GOVERNMENT RISK introduced and advanced to the third reading MANAGEMENT PLAN AND AUTHORIZING PAYMENT OF PREMIUM IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$33,436.00 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY Gaskey seconded. Gaskey, LeMay, Ingebritson, Lindeli and Sharp voted aye. LeMay then moved to adopt the resolution as an emergency. Sharp seconded. Gaskey, Ingebritson, Lindell, LeMay, and Sharp voted aye. Resolution passed as an emergency.

Update from January 21<sup>st</sup> Finance Committee met to review a ten-year financial outlook for the village. The consensus was that we need to pursue a roughly 3.0 mill (final millage is TBD) general fund levy to the November 2025 ballot which will be combined with the existing 2.8 mill renewal.

- Upcoming needs such as:
- o Repairs of the Elm Street Waterline
- Upgrade EMS Vehicle

Mr. LeMay plans on having a meeting with Ms. Lyons and the Hamilton County Auditor to confirm the process of the proposed tax increase.

Mayor Tepe explained that it is amazing that we have gone 11 years without an increase in our taxes. This is only because it is necessary.

Mr. LeMay reminded residents that less than 15% of your tax bill is for the Village of Terrace Park, 2/3rds of your tax bill is the school district.

## **Buildings & Grounds -**

Ms. Sharp updated council Regina Sharp, Jerry Hayhow and Jerry Frankenhoff met with Jessica Rice from ORF to review outstanding issues/questions with the ORF proposal which I have outlined below. They visited the Preserve to discuss specific areas to be treated.

#### Herbicide

It is a version of Round Up, it will be applied only by trained personnel of ORF, it will be a cut stump application using a spray bottle immediately after the cut to minimize disbursement to any surrounding area and be the most effective at killing the invasive plant.

## **Clearing process**

They will clear approximately 1 acre of property around the parking lot at the Miami Preserve It will not run adjacent any landowner property. We will leave a screen of plantings adjacent to those properties. The plants being removed will be woodies and vines growing up trees along with other potential invasives determined once the project starts. They will cut the plantings and haul them to the parking lot where village maintenance will haul them to the environmental services area. Signs will be posted in the area to alert hikers.

#### Cost

The initial year will be free of charge, they are no longer offering this to any other municipality. Ongoing, if the project is successful, the cost could be \$5,000 - \$10,000 if we choose to continue and it could be covered within the tree budget.

### **Timing**

Once we finalize the contract, we will determine timing, but likelihood is summer The ORF team will be onsite for four days in total.

Ms. Sharp introduced and advanced to the third reading RESOLUTION 2-3, 2025 AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE OHIO RIVER FOUNDATION REGARDING INVASIVE SPECIES REMOVAL AT MIAMI GROVE Lindell seconded. Gaskey, LeMay, Ingebritson, Lindell and Sharp voted aye. Sharp then moved to adopt the resolution as an emergency. Ingebritson seconded. Gaskey, Ingebritson, Lindell, LeMay, and Sharp voted aye. Resolution passed as an emergency.
